ACTS 11

Application Questions from Acts 11 for individuals or small groups:

- Why do you think Luke took the time to virtually repeat the events of Acts 10 in Acts 11? (Notice the change in attitudes between Acts 11:2 and 11:18. Also, look back at Acts 1:8 and Jesus' "game plan.")
- The second "telling" of the story in Acts 11 takes place through Peter's testimony of how God was at work in Cornelius and his household. How has sharing your testimony, or hearing the testimony of others, strengthened your faith? From Paul's words in 1Thessalonians 2:8, how does sharing the good news of the gospel work together with personal testimony?
- In a sense, Acts 10 records the "conversion" of Cornelius AND Peter. How were their conversions different? Similar?
- In the case of Simon Peter, his "conversion" in Acts 10 occurred well after his initial belief in Jesus as the Messiah. Can you recall "conversions" you have experienced beyond the time of becoming a Christian? Significant new understandings or surprising events which have turned your life toward God in a new way? Any decisive new chapters of accelerated spiritual growth? What was the catalyst?
- As a lifelong Jew, when Peter saw the vision of unclean animals he could not imagine eating unclean foods, yet Jesus had declared all foods clean (Mark 7:18,19). Likewise, Peter could not imagine the gospel going out to Gentiles without them first becoming Jews (including circumcision), yet Jesus had described this as God's plan in Acts 1:8.
- Can you think of a significant misunderstanding you had about the Christian faith or the gospel message? How as this corrected? A time when you considered someone "unclean", whom God had cleansed? Can you think of a time in which God challenged a long standing prejudice in your life? How was this overcome?
- Through a vision in prayer, and the voice of God's Spirit, Peter was convinced to obey God and to bring the gospel to Cornelius. How have you experienced God's guidance to go in a certain direction or to make decisions?
- Can you think of a time when you said aloud, or to yourself, "God would never ask me to do THAT." How important was obedience in Peter's assurance of God's will? Where do we need to obey God to gain reassurance about God's will in our lives?
