Prayer for Healing

On Sundays from 8 - 8:45 am and after the 9 am service, from 10:15-10:45am, prayer for healing is offered in a confidential, quiet and welcoming environment. The team is available to meet with you in prayer for every need of healing: healing of relationships, critical physical challenges, emotional brokenness, crises of faith, addictions, wounds of the past and present, etc. The place is Pastor Steve's office.

On Wednesdays in Lent, 7:00-8:00pm, we are journeying together and reading through Pond River Ocean Rain - a new book by Chaz Howard on finding peace in the storms of life. The text uses stories, questions, accessible illustrations, and water metaphors to enrich our understanding and experience of God. Over the course of our study we'll consider themes like stillness (like a pond), deeper trust in God's will (much like the current of a river), peace within mystery (as experienced in the depths of the ocean), and being used to bring forth growth in those around us (like the rain). Chaz, his wife Lia, and their three daughters have been worshiping here at Narberth Presbyterian Church for the last two years. Chaz has served for many years as Chaplain at the University of Pennsylvania

On Thursday nights in Lent, Pastor Steve is leading a weekly gathering on "Spiritual Training During Lent." You are welcome to come any week as you are able, to listen and/or to share how you are growing spiritually and any goals you are pursuing. The format is: (1). Brief time of teaching from Scripture. (2). Voluntary sharing – what practices are helping you to grow? What are you learning? How are you applying what you are learning? (3). How can we pray for you? Our goal is to foster an atmosphere of encouragement to strengthen our love for God and to grow more into the likeness of Christ. Think of it as analogous to meeting with a fitness coach at the Y or Planet Fitness during Lent. Thursday nights at 7:15-8:45 in the Parlor.

Year to Date- Y/E 2016

We are very thankful for your financial participation with NPC. Your gifts allow our ministry to continue, helping us to reach out and support missions locally and around the world, teach our children and youth, and maintain our church building.

For 2016, offerings fell \$45,178 below our 2015 total, and \$163,579 below budget. Our total spending in budgeted areas fell \$43,132 below budget, giving us a net result of a shortfall for the year in budgeted areas of \$120,477. This difference was funded out of cash on hand and our endowment.

Outside of the budget there was additional spending of \$198,129, most of which was related to various projects around the building funded by special gifts received in prior years.

In part due to three straight years of offerings falling short of the budget, the 2017 budget was reduced to \$1,161,000. Through February 2017, giving has totaled \$182,802, which is \$26,564 ahead of 2016 at the same time. A full report will be provided after we close the first quarter

We ask for your continued support of our ministry during 2017.

Young Life is looking to raise money to provide financial assistance to students for their annual summer camp trip. This year they are looking to do so by collecting gently used shoes. We are hoping to give a short pitch for the collection during a service and then place a bin or two somewhere in the church for people to drop shoes if they choose. This collection would take place over the course of maybe four Sundays this Spring. The organization we're working with, Funds2Orgs, facilitates these shoe collections and is the one who pays us for the shoes.
