- Saturday, or any days you are led, meditate more deeply on next week's passage, Acts 1:9-14
 Sermon: "Are We Preparing For Spiritual Awakening?"

Guidelines for reading Acts:

"The key to your reading of Acts is to recognize the "movement" of the gospel from Jerusalem to Rome, narrated in six parts (panels) and signaled by Luke's little summary statements in 6:7; 9:31; 12:24; 16:5; and 19:20. In each case the narrative seems to pause for a moment before it takes off in a new direction - sometimes geographically, sometimes ethnically, and sometimes both." (Gordon Fee, How To Read The Bible Book By Book).

Luke wants us to read Acts as "a play in which we are invited to become actors ourselves. The stage opens up and we discover we're in the middle of the action. That is part of the point of the "ending", which isn't really an ending: the story continues, and we are part of it." Acts 29! "It is a play in which the only true acting is what happens when the spirit of the playwright himself takes charge." (NT Wright, Bible Study Guide on Acts and Acts For Everyone).

ACTS 1

Acts 1:1-8 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." ⁶ Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Application Questions - for individuals or small groups:

- What is a witness? What are the points of comparison between a legal understanding of witness and a follower of Christ?
- What has been the most effective kind of witness you have observed or received from others?
- How would you most like to grow as a witness?
- How is God calling us at NPC to be witnesses of Christ in our community?
- What do you think Jesus meant by "power?" What is its purpose?
- How have you experienced the Holy Spirit? How would you describe that experience or its fruit? What can we do to receive more of the power of the Spirit?
- How would you evaluate the boldness of your faith? Do you desire to become more bold, and if so, what steps could you or we as a church take?
- What can we learn about witness from the progression of the gospel from Jerusalem to Samaria to the ends of the earth?
- Where in your life is your positive witness for Christ most needed?
 Where might God be calling you to step out with greater faith and love?
