## ACTS 4

### Acts 5:1-11

Now a man named Ananias, together with his wife Sapphira, also sold a piece of property. <sup>2</sup> With his wife's full knowledge he kept back part of the money for himself, but brought the rest and put it at the apostles' feet.

<sup>3</sup>Then Peter said, "Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of the money you received for the land? <sup>4</sup>Didn't it belong to you before it was sold? And after it was sold, wasn't the money at your disposal? What made you think of doing such a thing? You have not lied just to human beings but to God." <sup>5</sup>When Ananias heard this, he fell down and died. And great fear seized all who heard what had happened. <sup>6</sup>Then some young men came forward, wrapped up his body, and carried him out and buried him. <sup>7</sup> About three hours later his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. <sup>8</sup>Peter asked her, "Tell me, is this the price you and Ananias got for the land?" "Yes," she said, "that is the price." <sup>9</sup>Peter said to her, "How could you conspire to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out also."

<sup>10</sup> At that moment she fell down at his feet and died. Then the young men came in and, finding her dead, carried her out and buried her beside her husband. <sup>11</sup> Great fear seized the whole church and all who heard about these events.

## <u>Application Questions – for individuals or small groups:</u>

- From Acts 4:32-37, what stands out to you in this description of the early church?
- Barnabas is introduced in 4:36,37 with his new name, meaning "the son of encouragement." How would you describe the nature of his encouragement here, along with other places in Acts where he is mentioned? (9:26-28; 11:19-26). What are some ways you can grow in the ministry of encouragement?
- How is Barnabas a sharp contrast with Ananias and Sapphira? How is Acts 4:32-37 likewise a sharp contrast with 5:1-11? What can we learn from this striking juxtaposition?
- What did Ananias and Sapphira do that was so wrong? What was the essence of their sin? What do you think motivated them to sell the land? To keep part of the money? How are their actions and motives not consistent with Christian character and behavior?
- Why do you think there was such severe judgment against Ananias and Sapphira? What does this story reveal about the nature of God, the nature of the church, the nature of human beings? What word of hope or grace do you see in this story, since none of us is without sin?
- How does 1John 1:5-2:2 relate to this story, and how do we as Christians deal with our sin?
- According to Acts 5:11, what was the result of this episode? Do you think we as the church need more of this fear today? If so, why? What kind of fear is this, compared to the kind that is destructive?
- Is it possible to have the power of the Holy Spirit without conviction of our sin? How are you challenged to change as a result of this story?
