TREASURER'S REPORT

Important Giving Update:

Through the end of November, your offerings totaled \$908,168, slightly higher than last year's offerings for the eleven months. While \$252,000 short of annual budget of \$1,161,000 (over 20%), we do expect actual spending in budgeted areas to fall somewhat below the budget. It is also customary to see a large percentage of annual giving come in during the month of December, but we have not seen a jump through the first two Sundays of December.

Accordingly, we would ask that you prayerfully consider what you may be led to give in order to allow ministries to be fully funded for the year. Your giving allows our ministry to happen, both near and far, and expresses our gratitude to God for his many wonderful gifts to us, especially in this season of Christmas as we mark his greatest gift of all - His Son.
