# ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

<u>Pastor</u>: Though we have different gifts, together we are a ministry of reconciliation led by the risen Christ. We call people to faith, so that in the end, every knee will bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God. Within our common ministry, some members are chosen for particular work as Ministers of the Word and Sacrament, Elders, or Deacons. In ordination, we recognize these special ministries, remembering that our Lord Jesus said,

<u>People</u>: Whoever among you wants to be great must become the servant of all, and if you want to be first, you must be the slave of all, just as the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to set others free.

**Pastor:** God has called you by the voice of the Church to serve Jesus Christ in a special way. You know who we are and what we believe, and you understand the work for which you have been chosen.

Show your purpose by answering these questions:

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge Him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through Him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed Faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

For Elders: Will you be a faithful ruling Elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

<u>For Deacons</u>: Will you be a faithful Deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

**For the Congregation:** Do we members of the church accept these persons as ruling Elders and Deacons, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation, to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Do we agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?

**Starting Thursday night, January 25, at 7:00pm,** Pastor Steve will lead a 9 week in depth study of Mere Christianity by CS Lewis. This book, originally given as a series of 15 minute radio talks during the difficult days of WW2, is a modern spiritual classic.

In our own time of distress and upheaval, Mere Christianity draws us back to the center point of the gospel in Jesus Christ. If ever we needed to "keep the main thing, the main thing", the time is now. If you are seeking a stronger faith, and clearer understanding of Christianity, this is the best you can do in 190 pages!

Depending on the size of our group, the class will meet in the parlor and run each Thursday night from 7-8:30pm, January 25 through March 22. Please feel free to invite friends and especially those who may be spiritually seeking.

# ACTS 8

# Application Questions from Acts 8:26-40 - for individuals or small groups:

- In Acts 8, Philip left behind what might be called a "revival" in Samaria (8:5-8), ministering to crowds of people, only to travel down a long desert road for one person. What does this say about Philip? About God? How does this speak to you about the nature of success or compassion?
- Jesus promised the indwelling presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit beyond his death and resurrection (John 14:25,26; 16:7,13,14). How did Philip experience the guidance of the Holy Spirit?
- Have you ever felt directly guided by God? How did you discern that?
   How do we "test" the leadings of the Holy Spirit to make sure they come from God?
- Evangelism is a scary, sometimes unattractive word, even to Christians. What do you observe in the witness of Philip that is attractive and commendable? How does Philip's approach resemble Peter's instruction in 1 Peter 3:15?
- Philip preached the "good news of Jesus Christ" to this man. How would you describe the difference between "good news" and "bad news" evangelism?
- What are some possible ways you can "get into the chariot" with a neighbor or friend, or even stranger, to share your faith? How might God use your unique personality and spiritual gifts to share the good news of Jesus and to make a positive connection? How might God use NPC?
- Scripture played a central role in the Ethiopian Eunuch believing in Christ. Specifically, Isaiah 53 served as a powerful passage foreshadowing the redemptive suffering of Jesus. What role did Scripture play in your coming to faith? How can we effectively share the written word of Scripture to lead people to the living Word of Jesus Christ?
- As a black African, the Ethiopian Eunuch represented the gospel moving out to another racial ethnic group of people, a kind of bridge between the Samaritans earlier in Acts 8, and the Gentiles, with the initial conversion of Cornelius in Acts 10. What opportunities do we have to reach out to people different than we are, for the sake of the gospel?
- Do you see people in your life who are truly hungry for God like the Ethiopian Eunuch? How would you describe the level of spiritual hunger in yourself? In your world? In our culture?
