New Book Study - Thursday Nights - Mere Christianity!

Starting Thursday night, January 25, at 7:00pm, Pastor Steve will lead a 9 week in depth study of Mere Christianity by CS Lewis. This book, originally given as a series of 15 minute radio talks during the difficult days of WW2, is a modern spiritual classic.

In our own time of distress and upheaval, Mere Christianity draws us back to the center point of the gospel in Jesus Christ. If ever we needed to "keep the main thing, the main thing", the time is now. If you are seeking a stronger faith, and clearer understanding of Christianity, this is the best you can do in 227 pages!

Our class meets in the parlor and will run each **Thursday night from 7-8:30pm**, **January 25 through March 22.** Please feel free to invite friends and especially those who may be spiritually seeking.

This will be a monthly gathering to receive training on sharing our faith, and to hear stories of how we see God at work. The emphasis will be less on programs and more on people, and how God is leading us to reach out into the community with the good news of Jesus Christ. ALL are welcome to this time of encouraging one another to fulfill the Great Commission.

ACTS 9

Application Questions from Acts 9:10-31 for individuals or small groups:

- Stephen prayed for Saul as he was being stoned to death. Our story is probably less dramatic, but who has prayed for you and modeled the character of Christ? Who has been a Stephen in your life? For whom, can you be a Stephen?
- Stephen prayed forgiveness for Saul and the others who were responsible for his death. Soon thereafter, Saul's eyes were opened to the reality of Christ, suggesting a connection between Stephen's forgiveness and Saul's awakening of faith. Where have you witnessed the reconciling power of forgiveness? Where would you like to see this happen now?

Since Jesus had already revealed himself to Saul so directly and powerfully, why would God send Ananias to be with Saul? What is significant about the way Ananias addresses Saul in verse 17? What do you learn about the importance of the body of Christ in this story?

When have you, like Ananias, taken the risk to follow the leading of the Spirit, even when you had doubts and fears? Where would you like to grow in risky obedience?

Was there anyone like Ananias who prayed for you to receive Christ? Do you pray for others to know Christ? Do you keep a record or journal of prayer requests and answers?

- As you consider Barnabas welcoming Saul into the Christian community, what do you notice about how he did that? Can you describe your first time attending a church, or NPC, and any feelings of hesitation or anxiety you felt? How were those feelings overcome?
- What has most helped you to feel part of the church community? Where do you still desire a stronger connection?
- What if there had been no Barnabas at the door to actively welcome Saul? Are we aware of who's coming through our doors? Is there any kind of person you find it difficult to accept? Any people we consciously or unconsciously exclude?
- How does God intend our church to flourish, based on the summary statement of Acts 9:31? "Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace. It was strengthened and encouraged by the Holy Spirit. It grew in numbers, living in the fear of the Lord." WOW!
