# TREASURER'S REPORT AND SPECIAL OFFERING

## Treasurer's Update- Year to Date September

We are very thankful for your financial participation with NPC. Your gifts allow our ministry to flourish, helping us to reach out and support missions locally and around the world, teach our children and youth, and maintain our church building

Offerings through September total \$695,354, which is \$56,959 behind last year, and is just under 60% of our annual budget of \$1,175,000. We do normally see a sharp uptick in giving in the 4th quarter, but this year \$479,646 would be needed in the quarter to reach our 2018 budget. Through September, our spending in budgeted areas has been below budget. Operating expenses total \$369,095, which is \$24,524 below budget, as most areas continue to fall below budgeted pace. Total employee costs are \$473,283, which is \$10,245 below budget. That gives us a total of \$842,378 in expenses in budgeted areas, which is \$34,769 below budgeted pace, but exceeds year to date offerings by \$147,024.

There is an additional \$89,158 of spending outside of budgeted areas, primarily related to the transition from PCUSA to ECO, plus our Staff Housing Support Plan. This spending is funded out of our endowment.

As we approach the end of 2018, we ask for your continued support to help bring us closer to our budgeted needs, so we may fulfill God's purpose for NPC of building disciples in the love of Jesus Christ as we grow up in worship, grow together in community, and grow out in witness and service. Thank you!
