† FINANCIAL UPDATE:

Please take note of the church's financial position as we approach the end of the calendar year <u>and</u> the budget year. Although our expenses are slightly less than budgeted, we are falling short in offerings received to cover those expenses. As of the end of November, offerings for the year stand at approximately \$835,000 – which is about \$90,000 less than our actual year-to-date ministry expenses of \$923,218. Of course, in the final weeks there will be additional expenses as well. Please prayerfully consider how you can help us close that gap in the next few weeks so we end the year with our expenses met.
