UPDATE FROM SAFETY AND SECURITY

NPC Plans to Resume In-Person Activities:

Our Safety & Security Committee continues to develop NPC's plans to resume modified in-person activities. Listed below are three specific priorities we are working on now:

- Congregational Survey. We are seeking your help by completing this survey here. It will help us better understand your diverse views and appetite for attending in-person meetings and worship services and calibrate many aspects of the reopening plans to that which will need to be considered. It will take only 5 minutes and must be returned by Tuesday, July 7th. Thank you in advance for your participation!
- Small Group Meetings. In early July, initial small group meetings (<25 people) will be allowed in the Chapel and Parlor subject to important health protocols and leader and participant requirements. The small group plan is being reviewed by Session now. We expect to share the final plan and protocols shortly. Later in July, we will release other customized plans for specific groups, such as AA, Youth Group, Counseling Ministry, and Outdoor Meetings pending Session approval of those plans too.
- Worship Services. While Montgomery County is entering the "green" phase, with an abundance of caution, we are gearing toward a resumption of inperson worship services in late August/early September. As such, our final draft plan will be done in late July followed by the training of volunteer teams and final approval of the Plan by Session in mid-August. It is important to note that NPC's process toward reopening is not unidirectional. We retain the flexibility to rework the plans, as needed, particularly if the state's designations flow backward from green, to yellow and red.

There is no pressure for friends and members to resume in-person activities, particularly as virtual options will remain a very vibrant and safe option at NPC for everyone. Coming back to our campus is a personal choice and will vary by person and household. We want to hear from you. Please complete our survey ASAP!
