FROM THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Elders

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament Church provided persons with particular gifts to share in governing and ministry. Elders should be persons of faith, dedication and good judgment. Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel, both within the church and in the world.

It is the duty of elders, individually and jointly, to strengthen and nurture the faith and life of the congregation committed to their charge. Together with the pastor, they should encourage the people in the worship of God, equip and renew them for their tasks in the church and for their mission in the world, visit and comfort and care for the people, with special attention to the poor, the sick, the lonely and those who are oppressed. They should inform the pastor and the session of those persons and structures that may need special attention. They should assist in worship. They should cultivate their ability to teach the Bible and may be authorized to supply places that are without the regular ministry of the Word and Sacrament. Those duties that all Christians are bound to perform by the law of love are especially incumbent upon elders because of their calling to office and are to be fulfilled by them as official responsibilities. (Excerpts from the *Book of Order*)

Deacons

The office of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of sympathy, witness, and service after the example of Jesus Christ. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, of exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, warm sympathies, and sound judgment should be chosen for this office.

It is the duty of deacons, first of all, to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless, and to any who may be in distress both within and beyond the community of faith. They shall assume such other duties as may be delegated to them from time to time by the session, such as leading the people in worship through prayers of intercession, reading the Scriptures, presenting the gifts of the people, and assisting with the Lord's Supper. (Excerpts from the *Book of Order*)

NEW INFORMATION

Worship Services

On Tuesday, Aug 11th, Session reviewed the NPC Plan to Restart Worship Services. With a few modifications, Session has approved the plan with respect to the safety protocols (the "How"), providing authorization for NPC staff, ministry leaders, and others to begin implementing the preparation activities and recommendations in the Plan to enable a safe and healthy return to in-person worship services. The approved plan allows Session the flexibility to authorize implementation of in-person worship services at such time (the "When") as health conditions improve sufficiently and other relevant considerations allow for it. Meanwhile, our team will be coordinating with the Worship Committee as they develop their Plan to ensure safety protocols are met. Our team has also begun supporting Youth, Children, Greeter, Usher and Medical Leadership in the form of surveys, to inquire about availability of volunteers, and duties needed to support modified in-person worship services.

Narberth Presbyterian Church Preschool

Most summers are comparatively quiet for the Preschool, but not Summer 2020. Leaders have been busy researching best practices for educating and protecting the littlest members of our community, drawing upon state resources and local health experts. The result is a plan to resume in-person instruction which was approved at the August Session meeting on Tuesday. Approving the plan is only the beginning of making it happen. Now in-depth presentations to parents and meetings with teachers take place to make sure all know how Preschool will look different this fall as we seek to keep both kids and adults healthy. If you are a parent, you will soon get information on how this year will be different. If you are a teacher, you will soon have the opportunity to become familiar with the changes planned for this fall. While plans can change if local health metrics deteriorate dramatically, the plan is now to begin Preschool on September 15.
