SAFETY AND SECURITY COMMUNICATIONS

UPDATED INFORMATION

Worship Services. Now that Session has approved the NPC Plan to Restart Worship Services, the staff, ministry leaders, and many others have begun implementation efforts. These efforts will enable a safe and healthy return to in-person worship services as health conditions improve sufficiently and other relevant considerations allow. The Worship Committee is now meeting regularly to adapt the services so that safety protocols are met. In addition, the Safety & Security team recently worked with Youth and Children's Pastors, along with Greeter and Usher ministry leadership, to survey their groups views about participating and/or volunteering to support in-person worship services. We are also developing a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document, starting with hot topics and questions raised during Session's review. The aim is to share, refine and expand this document in the coming weeks as implementation issues and approaches are developed and clarified.

If you receive a survey from our Youth, Children, and/or Greeter and Usher ministries, please respond promptly. It will only take 5 minutes and will help inform aspects of the implementation plans. We also welcome your questions related to practical issues and hot topics regarding "new" worship service safety measures that will be addressed in the FAQ document noted above. Please submit your worship service questions to Tim Roykouff (<u>troykouff@narberthpres.org</u>). Please pray for NPC's leadership as we implement preparation activities. Finally, also pray for an outpouring of volunteers to support in-person worship services that hopefully resume in the not-too-distant future.

Small Groups. More group leaders have been scheduling in-person meetings indoors and out. There are now 8 locations available for gathering, with 5 open to all NPC small group leaders (see below) as well as 3 locations for Youth Group, Counseling, and AA groups. Out of love for our neighbor, all NPC gatherings, whether indoors or outdoors, will require mask-wearing, appropriate 6 foot social distancing and frequent hand washing. *Please contact Karen Pappas (kpappas@narberthpres.org) to schedule your small group meetings and obtain guidance for room setup and health safety protocols.*

Narberth Presbyterian Church Preschool

Most summers are comparatively quiet for the Preschool, but not Summer 2020. Leaders have been busy researching best practices for educating and protecting the littlest members of our community, drawing upon state resources and local health experts. The result is a plan to resume in-person instruction which was approved at the August Session meeting on Tuesday. Approving the plan is only the beginning of making it happen. Now in-depth presentations to parents and meetings with teachers take place to make sure all know how Preschool will look different this fall as we seek to keep both kids and adults healthy. If you are a parent, you will soon get information on how this year will be different. If you are a teacher, you will soon have the opportunity to become familiar with the changes planned for this fall. While plans can change if local health metrics deteriorate dramatically, the plan is now to begin Preschool on September 15.
