LENTEN DEVOTIONAL

Lent is a season to slow down and listen, and what better way to do that than by hearing the hearts of our church family. I encourage you to dive into our weekly Lenten devotional, *"The Week of..."* Each entry is written by friends and members of NPC and some you might sit beside in the pew on Sunday! Please join us in a beautiful opportunity to reflect on this sacred season through shared stories, prayers, and insights of our church family. Let's journey toward the cross together, one page and one voice at a time! We begin with:

The Week of Wilderness – Genesis 3:19

The Dust We're Already Breathing – Genesis 3:19

Your body knows Genesis 3:19 even if your mind has never read it. You feel it in the weight of fatigue, the ache that won't quite heal, the gray hair that wasn't there last year. "Dust you are, and to dust you shall return." This isn't ancient poetry; this is the sentence we're all serving. Lent begins by naming what we spend most of the year denying: we are fragile, we are breaking down, and left to ourselves, we are returning to the ground. The sweat on our faces isn't just physical exertion; it's the embodied anxiety of trying to keep it all together in a world that resists us at every turn. Work that should be joyful becomes grinding. Relationships that should be easy require constant repair. Even our own bodies betray us. This is what it means to be east of Eden, and Lent refuses to let us look away.

But the church observes these forty days not to wallow in mortality, but to prepare for what comes after it. When Jesus sweat blood in Gethsemane, He was taking the curse of Genesis 3:19 into His own body... the sweat, the thorns, the dust of the grave. He didn't bypass our mortality; He descended into it, all the way down. And then He did what we cannot do: He rose! Paul calls this "firstfruits." Jesus is the first harvest of a crop that includes us! Our dust isn't the end; it's the seed. Our burial isn't erasure; it's planting. Lent teaches us to stop clinging to the illusion that we can hold ourselves together and instead to fall into the hands of the God who raises the dead. The ashes on our foreheads mark us as mortal and, therefore, as candidates for resurrection.

Prayer:

God of life and death, I confess my body knows what my pride denies: I am dust, and I am returning to the ground. I am tired, I am breaking, and I cannot save myself. But You did not leave me to the dust. You sent Jesus to enter my mortality, to die my death, and to plant resurrection in the place of decay. This Lent, let me stop pretending and start trusting. Bury my false self. Raise Your true one. Amen.
